STEP at South Lakes is based out of the trailers 801 and 802 on the SLHS campus. Transportation is provided to/from home by FCPS school bus. Transportation to jobsites is provided through FCPS shuttle buses at designated times in the morning and afternoon.

### \*Travel Training / Community Based Instruction (CBI):

Travel training could take place a few times each quarter. It usually includes a full-day of instruction in different community locations.

### Attendance:

Daily attendance and punctuality are critical for successful employment. Students should come to school daily, on-time and ready for work.

Students are responsible for reporting if they will be late or absent. They should call the STEP classroom before 8:30am and their job site before their scheduled arrival time. This is to encourage students to develop appropriate and responsible workplace behavior.

- 1. You must notify STEP staff BEFORE 8:30am. If you do not notify staff, you will be marked absent for the day because attendance is taken at the beginning of the day.
- 2. Our work bus serves other schools. We CANNOT hold the work bus after 8:45am.
