# FCPS Distance Learning = Asynchronous Learning + Synchronous Learning

## Asynchronous Learning

- Students learn at different times throughout the week
- Teachers provide materials (videos, assignments, activities, links, group work)
- Feedback is provided to the student through collaborative tools and email
- Communication is not live
- Flexible and allows students to work at their own pace
- Due dates and time frames are important



### Examples:

Pre-recorded video, Narrated Slide Deck, Screencasts, EdPuzzle, Flipgrid Video, Pear Deck student paced lessons, Blog or Discussion boards, Collaborative documents

## Synchronous Learning

- Students learn at the same time, often at a scheduled class time
- Requires students and teachers to be online at a specific time
- Direct interaction between teachers and students
- Allows for instant feedback and clarification
- Checking in, Q & A, discussions and presentations occur at specific times in an online setting
- Often requires more bandwidth

# How to best support your child

Everyone learns best in different ways. This way of learning is new for everyone. Consider helping your child try different strategies until they find what works best. Remind them to be kind to themselves and others as we all learn and grow!

Families can help guide students through learning activities by suggesting your child use the following strategies:

- Use your home language to help you understand and process your ideas.
- Connect to what you already know to help you learn something new.
- Make a schedule for your day. What will you work on and when? Check it off as you finish!
- Set a timer for focused work time. Increase the minutes when you feel you can do more.
- Break long tasks into smaller parts. Complete one part at a time.
- Schedule brain breaks and physical exercise into your day.
- How do you learn best? Use your strengths, be creative, and have fun learning!



# Attendance

## **According to FCPS:**

**A student is considered absent when there is no evidence that the student participated in virtual learning, as expected.**

# Attendance Continued

Teachers will take attendance during learning sessions and ensure that all students are counted. Parents and caregivers can assist with this process by doing the following:

- Ensuring that their student(s) logs in to classes on time, and throughout the day.
- Calling or emailing the school attendance line if their student(s) are unable to participate.
- Communicating any concerns to the school, such as difficulty logging in or having access to FCPS classes.
- Reporting any hardship, such as student illness or any issue that might prevent the student from participating regularly.
- Returning phone calls or emails when notified that their student(s) did not participate that day.
- Ensuring that your student(s) submit activity logs as directed.

If your child is unable to login to live, face-to-face online instruction with their teacher, the teacher will be recording the class and posting the video within Blackboard/Google Classroom so it can be viewed at a different time. The video can also be used to provide review for all students

# Grading

Rolling Gradebook	Traditional Gradebook
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● <b>Cumulative</b> - Grades from each quarter carry over and build upon the previous quarter</li><li>● <b>Quarter grades</b> are a snapshot of a student's current progress in the course and demonstrate performance to that date, not just the quarter.</li><li>● <b>Final grades</b> are determined by a combination of all assignments and assessments throughout the year, regardless of the quarter the work was completed.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Grades are broken down by quarters</li><li>● <b>Quarter grades</b> are determined based on performance in the individual quarter and start over at the beginning of each quarter</li><li>● <b>Final grades</b> are determined by an average of quarter grades</li><li>● Quarters are averaged equally regardless of number of grades, assignment types, number of school days, etc.</li></ul>

Each Collaborative Team will decide which Gradebook will be used.
