The 4 Year College Application Process

How to Pick a College

- Consider your interests and goals
 - What fields am I most interested in, and what am I good at?
 - What are my academic and professional goals? Career Path?
 - Do I want to attend college away from home?
 - Will I need to earn money while in school?
 - Could an alternative to a traditional four-year university, such as an online college or community college, work for me and my goals?
- Reach, Target, "Safety"
- Research different types of institutions
 - 2-year vs. 4-year college (public or private) vs. trade school or apprenticeship program
- Understand the cost of college.


Financial Aid

- The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) is scheduled to be available December 1, 2024.
- Students and parents can (and should) create an FSA ID prior to Dec 1. at https://studentaid.gov/fsa-id/create-account/launch
- Some colleges (e.g., UVA and W&M) require students to complete the CSS Profile in addition to the FAFSA. CSS Profile can be done prior to FAFSA at the CollegeBoard website.




Registering for College Rep Visits


- ~100 schools will visit South Lakes from Sept Nov
 - Seniors (and juniors) must use Naviance to register to attend a visit



Registering for College Rep Visits

- After registering, ask your teacher's permission (verbally or through email) to be excused from class AT LEAST 24 HOURS BEFORE THE VISIT!
- Your Naviance registration confirmation serves as your pass. You MUST check-in with your teacher before coming to the Career Center/Lecture Hall on the day of the visit.
- It is the student's responsibility to make up any classwork missed.


Is my college on Common App? Or does it have it's own application?

It is important to know HOW your documents are being submitted. Ms. Evans and your counselor need to know this information to make sure your materials get to the right place.

It is YOUR responsibility to communicate that with us.

How do I know?

- Individual Colleges' websites post on their Admissions page
- You can check Naviance Student on the General Information Page for the school to find out if you can apply on Common App or if the school has another way to submit.
- The college/university website is always the most accurate.



Common App Information

Essays

- Some schools have their own essay (s)
- Personal statement should be "Generic" Generally need to be able to be sent to multiple schools, so not school specific
- Optional? Write one
- Chance to explain more about yourself That is why it is called the PERSONAL statement - passions, challenges, significant experiences- anything that you think college admissions should know about YOU.




Recommendation letters

- Counselor letter is more holistic information about you inside and outside of school
- Teacher letters more focus on you as a student in their class
- Have a conversation with your teacher about where and how you are applying prior to inviting them on Common App/Other App
- Teacher recommendation letters do not come to Counselors! Teachers upload their own.
- Be sure to invite your teacher to Common App/Other App, using their <u>@fcps.edu</u> email
 address just as you do your counselor
- Waiver of access rights in Common App
 - Yes! See next slide. **Once you submit your response you cannot make changes to this **


Common App - Recommendations and FERPA

- Before you can add your counselor or teacher as a recommender in Common App you must complete the Release Authorization in Common App.
- Colleges value letters of recommendation when the student has waived their right to review.

Students submit an application by a specified date and receive a decision in a clearly stated period of time.

Institutions review applications as they are submitted and render admission decisions throughout the admission cycle.

Students apply early and receive a decision well in advance of the institution's regular response date.

Students make a commitment to a first-choice institution where, if admitted they definitely will enroll and withdraw all other applications. The application deadline and decision deadline occur early.

Students apply to an institution of preference and receive a decision early. They may be restricted from applying ED or EA or REA to other institutions. If offered enrollment. they have until May 1 to confirm.



Schools that are Self-Report (SRAR - Student Reported Academic Record)

A copy of your transcript will be given to you and mailed home, KEEP IT! You can use this to input your courses and grades.

You still need to tell us that you are applying to these schools! There is a box to indicate if a transcript is needed-- if it is self-report please choose NO.

Example - Virginia Tech and Penn State are two examples of schools who do NOT require a transcript to be sent from South Lakes for the initial application; however, you have to complete a SRAR for these schools.

Common App - Inviting Recommenders

- You must indicate on the Transcript Request Form if you want your counselor to submit a letter of recommendation

 - Essay



Self-reflection:


- What fields am I most interested in, and what am I good at?
- What are my academic and professional goals?
- Is there career path do I wish to pursue?
- Will I need to earn an advanced degree to achieve my goals? What type of training is needed?
- Could an alternative to a traditional four-year university, such as an online college or community college, work for me and my goals?
- Take <u>Career Interest Inventories</u> (next slide)
- Interview adults in your life about their careers and what they like best about them.
- <u>Job shadow</u> at a business that sounds interesting to you
- Set up a <u>meetings with your school counselor or Ms. Luongo</u> to learn more about career options
- <u>Find a mentor</u>, or person you trust with knowledge and experience, who can help you figure out your career
- <u>Volunteer</u> for a local nonprofit group or volunteer organization, especially one that looks interesting to you
- Join <u>extracurricular activities</u> such as clubs, sports, music, or more to build leadership skills and grow your network.

Helpful advice: Use Naviance!

Don't know where to begin?

Start with Self Discovery

- 7 different self-assessments which can give feedback on what type of career would be a good fit
- Work backwards use the recommendations of possible careers and then find out what education/training you need, which may lead to particular majors and colleges
